



Bill "Rip" Rypkema

November 21, 1945 - July 1, 2019

Bill "Rip" Rypkema, 73 of Creal Springs, passed away Monday, July 1, 2019 in Memorial Hospital of Carbondale.

He was born to Floyd and Marcella (Ashley) Rypkema in Sparta on November 21, 1945.

Rip married Betty Nash on August 4, 1991.

He received a degree in criminal justice from the Southern Illinois University. He had worked for 16 years for the Carbondale Police Department earning the rank of Lieutenant. He then was the Chief of Police for 20 years at Western Springs. He also did the FBI training for the Yellow Brick Road.

Rip is survived by his wife, Betty Rypkema of Creal Springs; children, Michael (Gretchen) Rypkema; Matthew (Chaka) Rypkema, and Mandy (Jason) Rypkema, all of Portland, OR; a step-son, Dennis Nash of Springfield, MO; 8 grandchildren, a sister, Jo Ellen (Alan) Milligan of Buncombe; other relatives and a host of friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents; Junior & Marcella Henderson (parents that raised him) and a step-son, Stephen Nash.

Funeral Services for Bill "Rip" Rypkema will be Wednesday, July 3, 2019 at 1:00 pm in Crain Pleasant Grove-Murdale Funeral Home with Rev. Alan Milligan officiating.

Visitation will be from 11:00 am until the hour of the service at the funeral home.
