James Christopher Ryan Wells, age 40 of Murphysboro, passed away Monday, August 10, 2020 suddenly at home.

He was born July 1, 1980 to David and Darla (Ellet) Wells in Memorial Hospital of Carbondale.

A quote from one of James' favorite authors, J. R. R. Tolkien, "All we have to decide is what to do with the time that is given to us". James choose wisely, as he fully devoted his time to inspiring and developing his students to achieve their full potential in life.

James was a teacher for the Murphysboro School District, teaching 7th graders at Murphysboro Middle School. As described by one of his students, "James was more than a teacher". When he wasn't teaching in the classroom, he was volunteering his time to the MHS Key Club and Drama Club, MMS Builders Club and Drama Club, Murphysboro Apple Festival, Murphysboro Youth Center, and several other community service initiatives. James was also a second-degree black belt and donated his time to teach the discipline of karate to kids at the Murphysboro Youth Center. One of James' favorite hobbies was videography and photography. He enjoyed capturing life's special moments, whether it was those of his students or of his family.
