Raymond Melhorn, age 91 of Herrin passed away at 3:34 AM on Tuesday, September 8, 2020 at Herrin Hospital.

He was born July 22, 1929 in Herrin to Ben and Lucy Justice Melhorn. He married Lorna Jean Wiseman on May 5, 1950.

Ray was a long time member of Hurricane Memorial Baptist Church in Herrin, where he served as a deacon for many years. He was also a Past Master of the Herrin Masonic Lodge and received his 50 year Masonic pin on June 16, 2007. Ray had been a HAM Radio operator since 1951, and served as treasurer of the "Breakfast Club" and "Sara Radio Club" for many years. Ray was employed with the United States Postal Service for 29 years, and retired in 1995.
