Ann L. McNeill, 80, of Murphysboro, passed away at 8:27 a.m. Thursday, January 19, 2012, at St. Joseph Memorial Hospital in Murphysboro, Illinois.

A funeral mass will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, January 21, 2012, at St. Andrew Catholic Church with Father Gary Gummersheimer officiating and burial at St. Andrew Cemetery. Family and friends are asked to meet at the church. There will be no visitation. Memorials may be made to St. Andrew Church.

Ann was born on June 11, 1931, in Murphysboro, Illinois, to William Wolff and Edna (Schneider) Wolff.

She married William McNeill on September 1, 1956, in Murphysboro, Illinois, and he preceded her in death on July 26, 1989.
