



## Arthur "Pouch" Adam Poucher

Arthur "Pouch" Adam Poucher, 77, of Murphysboro, passed away at his residence in Murphysboro, Illinois, at 4:20 p.m. Saturday, August 25, 2012.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Wednesday, August 29, 2012, at Pettett Funeral Home and burial at Pleasant Grove Memorial Park with military services conducted by the American Legion Post # 127, V.F.W. Arthur married Susan Lee (Heise) Eichelmann on October 13, 1989, at Waterloo, Illinois, and she survives.
