Betty June Hall, age 85, of Denton, Texas, and formerly of Murphysboro, passed away at the Presbyterian Hospital in Denton, Texas, at 12:20 a.m., Thursday, October 23, 2008.

Funeral services will be held at 10:00 a.m. Monday, October 27, 2008, at Pettett Funeral Home with Rev. Shaker Samuel officiating and burial at Hillcrest Cemetery in Carterville.
