Betty J. Tuttle, 83, of Murphysboro, passed away at 1:55 a.m. on Wednesday, April 27, 2011, at her residence in Murphysboro, Illinois.

Funeral services for Mrs. Tuttle will be held at 11 a.m. on Friday, April 29, 2011, at Elm Street Baptist Church in Murphysboro, with Rev. Charles Allen officiating and burial at Pleasant Grove Memorial Park in Murphysboro.
