Doris Freitag, 84 of Carbondale, passed away at 9:12 pm on Thursday, May 14, 2015 in Manor Court.

She was born to Carl and Helen (Rogers) Freitag in Burlington, Iowa on December 4, 1930.

Doris married Louis Freitag on March 17, 1949. Together they shared 62 years of marriage. Louis passed away on December 12, 2011.

She graduated from Burlington High School and received an Associate's Degree from Burlington Jr College. After her youngest was in Kindergarten, Doris, an accomplished wordsmith, began her employment as a newspaper reporter in Clinton, Illinois. When the family relocated to Decatur, Illinois, she continued to employ her talent with words as a radio talk show host.
