April 10, 1916 - February 21, 2017

Doyle Charles Lingle, 100, of Dongola, IL, passed away at 4:15am, on February 21, 2017 at Union County Hospital.

He was born on April 10, 1916 in Pulaski County, IL, the son of Charles and Erva (McIntosh) Lingle. He married Madelyn Sheffer in 1938 who preceded him in death on December 6, 1973. Doyle then married Betty Johnson on February 14, 1976. They shared the next 35 years together working the family farm, traveling, fishing and enjoying family gatherings. One of their favorite pastimes was to visit Branson, MO, where they enjoyed fishing for trout. Betty preceded him in death on September 26, 2011.

Doyle lived and worked his entire life in the Dongola area as a farmer, part time rural mail carrier, carpenter and retired a head mechanic at SIEC. He was an avid outdoorsman and enjoyed many years with his sons and grandchildren hunting and fishing. He harvested his last deer at the age of 88. He continued to fish until the age of 97. Doyle was a master woodworker and made many heirlooms for his entire family.

He is survived by his sons, Barry (Marlene) Lingle of Dongola and Gregory (Laura) Lingle of Leland, IL; 4 stepchildren, Linda (John) Nicholson of Clinton, IL, Joyce (Kenmore) Rowe of Dongola, Sharon (Roger) Menees of Anna and Gordon (Sheri) Johnson of Hickory, KY; a special niece, Marla Jean McAdoo

and family. He leaves 16 grateful grandchildren and 32 great grandchildren.
