Edward "Scott" Ferrill, 49, of Murphysboro, passed away at 9:18 p.m. Saturday, February 9, 2019, at St. Joseph Memorial Hospital in Murphysboro.

Scott was born on July 19, 1969, in Murphysboro, to Elmer "Butch" and Alice (Sill) Ferrill.

He served in the U.S. Army during both Desert Shield and Desert Storm.

He has been working at the Illinois Department of Transportation in highway maintenance for the past twenty years.

Mr. Ferrill was a member of the DeSoto Masonic Lodge # 119, a lifetime member of the V.F.W. Post # 7190, and the Teamster's Local # 50.

Scott married Anna Schultz on October 3, 1992, in Murphysboro, and she survives.
