



## Floyd "Hoppy" Hopkins

November 28, 1935 - January 22, 2026

Floyd "Hoppy" Hopkins, age 90, of Murphysboro, passed away on Thursday, January 22, 2026 at St. Joseph Memorial Hospital in Murphysboro.

He was born on November 28, 1935 to Bill and Lula (Cook) Foster in Murphysboro, Illinois.

Hoppy was a well-known local meat cutter at Alden's Market and Charlie's Market both in Murphysboro. He then went to work at Southern Illinois University as a supervisor in building maintenance. He had also sold cemetery property for Murdale Gardens of Memory years ago. Hoppy was a veteran of the United States Navy, a member of the local Lions Club and had coached 4-H softball in years past.

Survivors include his wife of 70 years, Patricia "Pat" Hopkins; daughters, Tamarra "Tammi" (John) Williams and Durice (Rick) Runge; five grandchildren, Brian (Heather), Jeremy, Ashley, Travis (Rachel), and Madison (Matt); five great-grandchildren, Lexy, Rylee, Alex, Aidan, and Logan; sister, Alice (Butch) Ferrill; brother, George; and several nieces and nephews.

Along with his parents, he is preceded in death by his brother, Andy Hopkins; sisters, Rosie Hamilton and Dora Fricke; and two sisters who passed in infancy.
