George David Baron, age 58, of Poplar Bluff, Missouri, and formerly of Cape Girardeau, Missouri, passed away surrounded by family on December 29, 2021.

George was born on December 9, 1963 in Fort Campbell, Kentucky. He graduated from Cape Central High School in Cape Girardeau in 1982 and attended Southeast Missouri State University.

“ I was deeply saddened to hear of George's passing. I met George in 1974 when we played Little League Baseball for the Blue Jays. George was an excellent baseball player. He could hit for average, hit for power, he could throw very hard and was a great infielder. I remember several times George and I would warm up before the game. George would throw so hard you made sure you caught the ball in the webbing and not the heel. If you caught the ball in the heel your hand would sting for at least five or six minutes after the warm up. George played an excellent third base and would sometimes pitch. George and I met again at L.J. Schultz Middle School. George attended Trinity Lutheran and I attended Alma Schrader grade school so we did not see each other until 1976 when we both started Schultz. In Junior High School in 1978/1979 Seth Siemers and I would walk over to Tony Spinners after school to watch the band practice and play. The band consisted of George on drums, Tony Spinner on guitar and vocals, Andy Scholl on guitar and Kevin Rellegert on bass. The band was VERY Good with a lot of talent. I remember them playing A Lot of Ted Nugent because he was very popular at the time. They would play Motor City Mad House, Storm Troopin, Snake Skin Cowboy by Ted Nugent and also songs by other artists. I remember in 1980 Kim Baker had her 16th birthday at the Pike Lodge the old Marquette School. George and the band TORE it up that night in front of forty or fifty people and everyone had a Real Good Time! I worked with George at Del Farms Supermarket and graduated with George in 1982 from Cape Central High. We also had a history class together at Southeast Missouri State University.

“ I was deeply sadden to hear about George's passing. We were very good friend since 1974 when I met George on The Blue Jays Little League team. George and I did not know each other until then because George attended Trinty Lutheran Grade School and I attended Alma Schrader Grade School. Geoge was an EXCELLENT baseball player! He could hit for power and could throw Very Hard. I remember George and I would warm up before the game with pitch and catch. George would throw so hard you could hear my baseball glove pop and your hand would Always sting if you caught the ball in the heel instead of the webbing. George played a Strong 3rd base and sometimes he would pitch. He was one of the BEST players on the team and would usualy bat 3rd, 4th, or 5th in the line up. I met George again in 1976 when we both attended L.J. Schultz Middle School and became good friends again. I remember in Junior High Seth Siemers and I would walk over to Tony Spinners house after school and watch Tony's Band. It included George on drums, Tony would sing and play lead and rhytm guitar, Andy Scholl would play lead and rhythm guitar and Kevin Rellegert was on bass. "THE BAND" sounded just like the professionals. They played mostly Ted Nugent songs like Motor City Madhouse, Storm Troopin and many others by Ted Nugent and other artist. I remember George and "The Band" playing at the Pikes Lodge for Kim Bakers birthday party in High School. They tore it up that night and the crowd of fifty to sixty people went nuts! Geogre and I worked together at Del Farms Grocery store and graduated Cape Central High School in 1982. George was a VERY GOOD FRIEND and he is Deeply Missed! God Bless you George!
