George W. "Jack" Raynor, age 92, formerly of Murphysboro, passed away at 5:31 p.m. Saturday, June 19, 2010, at Memorial Hospital in Carbondale, Illinois.

Jack was known for raising prize winning rabbits.

He married Lucille Tuttle on April 6, 1939, in Jackson, Missouri, and she preceded him in death on January 8, 2006.

He is survived by one grandson Joshua Raynor and one daughter in law Pat Raynor, both of Nashville, TN,

two brothers Franklin "Dee" Raynor of Bunker Hill, IL and Charles Raynor of McKenney, VA;
