Greg Corzine, age 70, of Dongola, passed away on Tuesday, January 13, 2026 at the Deaconess Illinois Union County Hospital in Anna, Illinois.

He was born on May 15, 1955 to Wendell Orlan and Myra Colleen (Fisher) Corzine in Anna, Illinois.

After graduating Dongola High School, Greg joined the United States Marine Corps where he served from 1973 until 1980. He then returned to Dongola and worked at Corzine Hardware and Appliance Center serving the area until his death and never turning anyone away. Greg attended Shawnee College and Southern Illinois University. Greg served as Mayor of Dongola from December 2011 to Present and served as a Village Board Member for many years prior to his serving as Mayor. Greg was a proud veteran and he was a

member of the American Legion and the Marine Corps League in Cape Girardeau, MO. Greg was also an active member of the Wetaug Church of Christ and involved with the American Legion Cemetery.

Survivors include his brother, Cris Corzine; several cousins; one aunt; and many friends.

He is preceded in death by his parents.

Funeral Services will be held on Monday, January 19, 2026 at 2:00 PM with Brent Miller officiating at Crain Funeral Home in Dongola. Visitation will be held prior to the service from 11:00 AM until 2:00 PM at the funeral home.
