He was born Sept 30, 1955 in Cape Girardeau, the son of Melvin Lindell Brennecke and Blanche Othello (Kent) Brennecke.

After graduating from Cape Central High School in 1975 John enlisted in the US Army and served 4 years in Germany. After his Honorable discharge he continued to serve in the National Guard and in 2007 he volunteered once again for active duty and became the oldest serving sergeant in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

John was well loved by the staff at Southeast Hospital where he worked as a security guard for many years. He was a member of the Cape Eagles, and enjoyed riding his Harley down many a quiet country road talking with God.
