Joseph Caterino, 87, of Murphysboro, went to be with the Lord and to be with his beloved wife Norma at 12:47 p.m. Friday, November 19, 2010, at St. Joseph Memorial Hospital in Murphysboro, Illinois.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Wednesday, November 24, 2010, at Pettett Funeral Home with Rev. P. K. Sunny and Rev. Paul Hicks officiating and burial at DeSoto Cemetery.
