Leah Marie Sims, age 94, of Murphysboro, passed away Sunday, November 24, 2024 at her home surrounded by her family.

She was born on October 9, 1930 to Troy Shannon and Myrtle Elizabeth (Harper) Bradley in Franklin County, Illinois. On December 20, 1951, she married Eugene T. Sims, Jr. and they spent over 59 years together until his passing in 2011.

Leah received a Bachelor's Degree in Music Performance from Southern Illinois University, and a Master's Degree from Florida State University in Music Education. She taught elementary through high school music and choir in Florida and Murphysboro for 30 years, where she also directed concerts, madrigal dinners, and musicals. She directed the Murphysboro Community Choir in seasonal performances of The Messiah. She was a very active

member of First Baptist Church where for many years she played piano, directed the choir, and taught Sunday school.

Survivors include her son, Michael Bradley Sims; daughters, Kerry Lee (Patrick) Brockhagen, Jeanne Marie (Michael) Wikete; two grandsons, Evan Sims, Timothy (Kimberly) Sims; two granddaughters, Jessie Sims, Laura Lee (Mitchel) Bowen; one great-granddaughter, Hannah Sims; one great-grandson, Leo Bowen; one great great-grandson, Silas Sims; and sister-in-law, Virginia Sims.

She was preceded in death by her infant brother, her parents, and her husband.

The family wishes to thank her two caregivers, Tammy Boucher and Marcy Thomas, and the staff of Residential Hospice for their kindness and compassion.

Visitation will be held Friday, November 29, 2024 from 4:00 PM until 7:00 PM at Crain Pleasant Grove-Murdale Funeral Home.

I was one such student who grew under her direction. She saw my potential and casted me as Harold Hill in THE MUSIC MAN during my senior year, much to the chagrin of many. Tuning out the noise, she focused on me and the task at hand. I lacked the self-confidence and remember going into her office and telling her I was "quitting."

That went over like a lead balloon.

She refused to accept my excuses, and by doing so, taught me a valuable lesson of perseverance and following through with a commitment. I still have the note she wrote me after the performances and in it she stated, "Don't let small things cloud your vision."

“ I signed up for Leah's chorus class Freshman year. I'd been in chorus all through school. I absolutely loved to sing. She could tell by my enthusiasm that I would sing anything she put in front of me, even though I was faking sight reading.

And when I took my place amongst the Altos, where I'd always sang, and Angie (a Senior, and the most beautiful voice!!) took me by the arm back up to the piano, I had no idea what was about to happen. Angie informed Leah that even though I was standing in the Altos section, but next to her in the First Soprano section, somehow, I was singing in key with her.

And Leah asked me to run the scales. I thought it was a bit of fun, to see how high I could go. After her tests, she looked at me and asked what voice part I sang. I told her I'd always sang Alto. Leah, exasperated, shook her head and exclaimed, "What a tragedy!" and gave me the biggest hug. She told me from that day forward, I was a First Soprano, and would be training with Angie.

After that, she and I had a special connection. We would sometimes meet early before class and go over music pieces. And sometimes she would listen to me sing pieces that I was working on for contests or shows. She supported me, encouraged me, loved me.

I was small, not a child, but a young woman in a small frame, and Leah gave me a dress that once belonged to her daughter. It was long, and ruffled, with white eyelet lace that tied at the waist in the back. It was my very first formal dress. It went to the floor and was beautiful.

Leah gave it to me because she said I reminded her of her daughter, a tiny Barbie doll, a slip whisp of a thing, she said. She said it was so troublesome finding things tiny enough to fit her, and she bet my mom had the same problem finding things to fit me as well. Leah was right, of course.

She was always doing things like that. She was like a second mom to me. Leah listened when I needed a little extra support. Especially whenever things at home weren't going so well.

I know I wasn't the only one. She was the Grande Dame of the Music Room. Several of us claimed her as our own. And she claimed us back. She talked WITH us, not at us, helping us to see the rights and wrongs of our decisions.

I will remember Leah like a John Hughes movie, with love, fondness, and sadness too. I can't believe she is gone, and I didn't get to say goodbye. I will always carry her in my soul, and when I sing out, I'll hit the high note through my breathing just for you, Mrs. Leah Sims, because that's what you taught me to do. ❤️
