



## Lottie May Marshall

August 13, 1923 - December 19, 2014

Lottie May Marshall, 91, of Murphysboro, passed away at 8:53 a.m. Friday, December 19, 2014, at Friendship Manor in Nashville, Illinois.

Lottie was born on August 13, 1923, in St. Louis, Missouri, to Charles Monroe Burnett and Edna (Wedgewood) Burnett Sinclair.

Mrs. Marshall was a very active member of St. Peter's United Church of Christ in Murphysboro. She was a member of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, and a member of the Murphysboro Day Unit of the Jackson County Home Extension.

She and her husband Russell started with a neighborhood grocery store in 1946 and eventually sold Marshall's IGA in 1966. She worked there and also worked for twelve years at the YMCA Pool in Murphysboro.

Lottie married Russell Marshall on September 21, 1943, in St. Louis, Missouri, and he preceded her in death on April 18, 2013.
