Paul Allen Hendrix, 86, passed away peacefully on March 11, 2016, at home in Cape Girardeau with his family by his side.

He was born on May 26, 1929 in Poplar Bluff, Missouri to the late Rev. Francis and Clara Hendrix. He married Mary Emma Hendrix on November 22, 1961. Mary is the daughter of the late Virgil and Marie Vinson of Charleston, Missouri.
