May 20, 1946 - December 21, 2016

Professor Salah-Eldin Ahmed Mohammed, age 70 of Carbondale, formerly of Sudan, passed away on Wednesday, December 21, 2016 in Manor Court.

He was born May 20, 1946 to Ahmed and Amna Mohammed Khair in Sudan.

He married Salwa Eltayeb Elguzouli in Sudan.

Salah received his PHD in England and joined the Southern Illinois University in 1984. He retired in 2014 and held the position of Professor Emeritus until his death.

He is survived by his wife, Salwa Eltayeb Elguzouli of Carbondale; two sons, Yasar Mohammed of Carbondale and Hussan Mohammed of Los Angeles, CA; a brother, Tarig Ahmed Mohammed and sister, Busayna Ahmend Mohammed; other relatives and many friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents.

Prayers were held at the Mosque on December 21, 2016. Burial was held at the Pleasant Grove Memorial Park.
