



## Ronald Claude Flowers

March 3, 1932 - November 23, 2008

Ronald Claude Flowers, age 76, of Murphysboro, passed away Sunday, November 23, 2008, at Garden Park Hospital in Gulfport, Mississippi, as a result of a heart attack while vacationing.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Saturday, November 29, 2008, at the United Methodist Church with Rev. Larry Gilbert and Rev. Earl Renshaw officiating, and burial will be at Pleasant Grove Memorial Park. Friends may call from 4 to 8 p.m. Friday at Pettett Funeral Home and from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. Saturday at the church.
