A graduate of the University of Illinois, Chicago, Sharon also earned a Master's degree in Mathematics from Southeast Missouri State University. Sharon was a dedicated and caring teacher that spent the majority of her career at Marquand Zion teaching mathematics to grades 7-12. During this time she was awarded the Presidential Award for Excellence in teaching Mathematics, 1993.

Reading and Gardening were some of the hobbies she enjoyed but she particularly loved singing and was a member of the local singing group "Sweet Adeline's" for many years.

She was preceded in death by her two sisters, Marlene Croy (1993), and Betty Jean Schwarz (1995). Loving survivors include a nephew, Michael (Angela) Marston, and two great nephews, Nicholas and Caden Marston, of Cape.
