He had a gift for storytelling and especially enjoyed reminiscing about fun times with family and friends. He often spoke of the adventures of his youth. These memories brought him great joy, and he relived them often with laughter.

Steve deeply loved his children and family. While he wished for more time together, his love was unwavering and profound. He will be remembered for his big heart, his wit, and the lasting connections he made with everyone he met.
